

HISTORY

Crystal Hot Springs, originally named Madsen Hot Springs, was used by the Native Americans as a campsite during the winter. Located along the Northern part of the Wasatch Mountain range, it provided a natural windbreak from the bitter winter winds. The hot springs also provided a much needed heating source. It is rumored that an Indian burial ground is located on the premises.


As the Transcontinental Railroad was being built, the Chinese railroad workers learned of the hot springs, made tubs out of cedar wood and allowed the refreshing waters to flow into them.

This provided a relaxing and muscle-soothing mineral bath for them. Soon the area around the hot springs became occupied with more and more settlers. With their coming, the hot springs grew in popularity. Around this period of growth, Abraham Hunsaker, a local bee keeper, was instrumental in establishing the town of Honeyville. According to some of the locals' memories and recollections, the town was originally called "Hunsakerville". But Abraham was a humble man and asked that it be given another name. In honor, then, of Abraham's profession, it was renamed "Honeyville".

Crystal Hot Springs became a business enterprise in 1901. Because of its exceptional crystal clear waters, it is not surprising it was given this name. Crystal Hot Springs' uniqueness derives from the fact that it has a hot springs and a cold springs which come together within 50 feet of each other. Thus, by mixing temperatures and optimal relaxing conditions in each of its pools. These wonderful healthful waters offer families, campers and guests year round.

YEAR-ROUND FAMILY FUN

General Geology—Crystal Hot Springs is a year-round natural hot and cold springs water park and campground. The springs are located in Honeyville, Utah, about 10 miles north of Brigham City. The springs forms Salt Creek, which empties into the Bear River, which is south of the springs. The natural hot springs range from 121 ~ 134° F and has remained fairly constant during the past 145 years. The springs has a very high mineral content, higher than any other hot springs in Utah. The natural hot spring has Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) values around 45,000 mg/L. (In contrast, sea water has a TDS level of 35,000 mg/L.) The bulk of the dissolved solids in our hot spring are sodium (14,600 mg/L) and chloride (27,500 mg/L). This is what gives the water in the hot tubs and soaker pool their salty tang and their greenish color look. There are at least another 21 trace minerals that naturally are found in the hot springs including a therapeutic mineral many people know as Lithium. Lithium is a natural relaxant of muscles and has been known to control the mood extremes of bipolar disorder.

We cool the hot mineral pools off with the naturally cool, fresh water spring. This 52° F cold spring is how we cool off the 130° F hot mineral springs so that you may enjoy your choice of 1 of 4 different temperature mineral spas. These hot and cold springs are the same springs that fill our Olympic pool during the summer season.

One of the World's most unique natural hot and cold springs that are less than 50 feet apart. The springs bubble up at temperatures of 130° F and 52° F. These waters supply the 300,000 gallon Olympic size pool in the summer, three hot tubs, soaker pool, lap pool and the waters which flow down the hydro-tube slides. Pool temperatures range from about 75° F to 105° F year-round.
